Trustee Report

Cheska Avery-Stafford and Angela Lueck We are continuously receiving updates regarding the recent \$20 million dollars in state funding that technical colleges will have access to for training and expansion. This funding became available following a bipartisan bill voted on in January of this year. The goal is to expand the dental workforce in the state of Wisconsin. Thus far 14 programs have made announcements for plans to either expand their current programs or add programs for Expanded Function Dental Assistants or Dental Therapists.


Recently, Maine became the seventh state to join the Dentist and Dental Hygienist Compact. This officially activates the DDH Compact, allowing the first states to appoint their commissioners and beginning the process of allowing for greater licensure portability around the country. To recap, the first seven states are Washington, Iowa, Tennessee, Wisconsin, Kansas, Virginia, and

Maine. There is active legislation pending in several states this year, including Colorado, Missouri, Ohio, Minnesota, Pennsylvania, and New Jersey.

Please take time to watch the series of WIDPAC 101 videos that have been recently released with the intention of encouraging contributions. Funding for WIDPAC allows us to sustain important relationships with legislators that support oral health in Wisconsin.

Registration is now open for the next 2024 WDA Town Hall on Tuesday, June 25. The Town Hall will be held on Zoom at 6 p.m. Featured speakers will include WDA President Dr. Chris Hansen (Manitowoc), Executive Director Mark Paget and Director of Membership and Communications Brenna Sadler. The Pyramid of Pride Awards dinner has been renamed the WDA Presidents Gala and will be held on Friday, November 8, 2024. This event will have a new format that will include entertainment and will serve to celebrate both the outgoing WDA President and congratulate Wisconsin dentists and friends of dentistry through the annual awards program.

This month Marquette University School of Dentistry will graduate the Class of 2024. This is the first class in the nation that will be eligible for "diploma privilege". That means there is no need to pass a written and practical national exam if they practice in Wisconsin. DSPS Secretary Hereth stated, "This decision reflects the Board's and DSPS's understanding that the work Marquette School of Dentistry students do through the school's curriculum and required clinical work is more rigorous and thorough than a one-day practical exam." Within three days of Marquette certifying graduation, DSPS will ensure those dentists have licenses in hand. About 25 have taken advantage of this new licensure pathway. Congratulations to all the graduates!!!!

It is with sad but grateful hearts that we share the passing of Jeffrey Claude Becherer, DDS on March 14, 2024. Jeff was surrounded by his family and had a peaceful transition to heaven.

Jeff was the beloved husband of Susie (nee Stilp) Becherer and together they had six children. He was a loving and present father and father-in-law He was the cherished "Bop" to 22 grandchildren

and was happiest when surrounded by them. Jeff loved to talk about his family and ever-growing cadre of grandkids. He was very proud of and thankful for his legacy.

Jeff was born in Milwaukee and lived nearly his entire life in Wauwatosa, which he loved dearly. He attended St. Pius grade school, Marquette University High School, where he played keyboard in a band or two and formed the bottom right base of the cheerleading pyramid, then followed in his father Carl's footsteps when he attended Marquette University and Marquette University School of Dentistry, graduating in the class of 1972 with average grades and good stories.

Jeff took over Carl's dental practice, Becherer Dental on 71st and North Avenue, shortly after and thus began a decades-long career that was a true passion and calling. Jeff loved dentistry. He was an excellent practitioner, with a gentle and calm bedside manner, and he formed lasting relationships with so many of his patients. He could hardly leave his house without running into yet another patient he had helped over the years. He loved that and loved serving his community. His artistry and superior fine motor skills were put to good use in several of his children's grade school dioramas and art projects, for which he always received an A. Thanks, Dad!

Jeff was a ton of fun and knew how to enjoy life! He was a diehard Brewers fan, and spent many afternoons and evenings at County Stadium, always pretty sure this was the year his Brew Crew would win the World Series. He lived for Marquette basketball, and he and Susie were there when they won it all in 1977. He visited Disney World in 1971 in its inaugural year, and this sparked a lifelong love for Disney that he joyously passed on to all of his children and grandchildren. Music was a huge part of Jeff's life and he could often be heard playing "Last Date" and "Chantilly Lace" on the Steinway piano he liked nearly as much as he liked his kids. He held Mercedes Benz in the highest esteem and one of his biggest regrets was letting go of his silver Gullwing. Oh well. Jeff was known to enjoy a Beefeater martini or two (never three) and his kids grew up fighting over who got the coveted gin-soaked olive. Suffice it to say, there was no shortage of fun and laughter and good cheer for Jeff. He had a huge smile that came out easily and often. He was a true optimist, rarely complained, and figured things would probably work out.

In his later years, Parkinson's took away some of the ease and joy in his life, but he remained the kind and loving patriarch that he had always been. Susie took excellent care of him through it all, and together they taught us many lessons on courage, love, and perseverance. Jeff lived out the last week of his life at Zilber Family Hospice, receiving immaculate care in a room bursting with family, happy memories and 1000 piece puzzles. We could not be more proud of his life and legacy.
