Passed away peacefully at his home in Mequon on Jan. 15th at age 102 surrounded by family and loved ones. He is survived by his life partner, Harriet Bocksenbaum; children, Brooke (Peter) Cohen, Bret (Sue Peterson) Goodman, and Blane (Judi) Goodman; Amy (Mark) Kleinerman and Kurt (Leah) Bocksenbaum; granddaughters, Bevan Cohen,

Sydney and Mara Kleinerman, Elizabeth Bocksenbaum and Elizabeth Goodman, and grandsons, Andrew and Charlie Goodman. Further survived by great-grandchildren, other relatives and friends. He was preceded in death by his beloved wife, Beverly (nee Altman) Goodman, mother of Brooke, Bret and Blane; by his parents, Harry and Marcelle (nee Erenske) Goodman; and by his brother, Fred Goodman.

A graduate of the University of WI, Madison and the Marquette School of Dentistry, Dr. Goodman served as a Lieutenant in the U.S. Navy at the base hospital in Samar, Philippine Islands, as well as on the USS Fulton, a submarine tender, and on San Francisco's Treasure Island.

After his military service, Dr. Goodman's dental practice focused on helping non-ambulatory and geriatric patients, often going to their homes to treat them, which he did well into his 90s. He was affiliated with Mount Sinai Hospital for over 20 years, including serving as the dental department's Chief of Staff.

Dr. Goodman went on to operate Goodman-Bensman Funeral Homes, the first exclusively Jewish funeral home in the state of WI, which was founded by his father, Harry B. Goodman, in 1927.

Dr. Goodman had a great passion for life. He was an avid bridge player, accomplished pilot and had a love for all sports, including golf, tennis, skiing, among many others. His second love other than his family was animals. His smile and generous spirit will be greatly missed by all who knew him. May his memory forever be a blessing.

He was a WDA and GMDA member for 78 years and happened to be the WDA's oldest living member.

RADIATION REGULATIONS

Recent changes in state inspection procedures have made certain radiology safety documentation more important.

For those that would like to handle this in house, you can go to <u>Radiation Protection | Wisconsin Department of Health Services</u> website and click on the link for the guide at <u>| Wisconsin</u> <u>Department of Health Services</u>.

All registrants are required to have a radiation safety program and written radiation safety policy. This policy should establish procedures that will minimize exposure to employees. A point person, Radiation Safety Officer (RSO), must be designated and an annual review of these procedures undertaken. A "Notice to Employee" document must be posted in an employee accessible area. The guide at the link above includes appropriate training subjects and Individual Radiation Monitoring Requirements.

All radiation exposure should follow the ALARA (As Low As Reasonable Achievable) principle. No x-ray exams shall be taken unless ordered by a dentist. DHS 157 in the state statutes has more information. <u>Wisconsin Legislature: DHS 157.86</u>

GMDA was recently contacted by Reagan Saxe and Jennifer Bjork from Strategic Dental Imaging regarding their services. Their information is included for anyone interested in using their state site visit consulting. "Preparing for a state site visit is crucial to ensure your dental office complies with safety regulations. Recent changes in state inspection procedures have made certain radiology safety documentation more important. TRUSTEE REPORT

We hope that 2024 has been off to a great start for our fellow colleagues! We are happy to report that the Wisconsin Dental Association's legislative efforts recently resulted with several bipartisan bills being signed into law by Governor Evers. The bills were part of a package that includes the WDA's main legislative priorities. The package included Act 87 - Dental Therapy, which will now go the Dental Examining Board for implementation, Act 88 – Dentist and Dental Hygienist Compact, Act 89 - \$20 Million for technical college oral health programs, Act 90 – Marquette Rural Scholarships, and Act 91 - Assignment of Benefits which is scheduled to go into effect on September 1, 2024. By signing Act 88 – Dentist and Dental Hygienist Compact, Wisconsin became the fourth state to support this nationwide effort, behind lowa, Tennessee, and Washington. This legislation is pending in several states. The compact will become operational when a minimum of seven states have adopted the legislation. It is important to keep in mind that the above legislative wins for the state of Wisconsin occurred following the tireless efforts of WDA member dentists working with lawmakers from both parties with the intention of positively affecting oral health.

By now, we hope that everyone is aware of the WDA Savings Club initiative and encourage everyone to sign up. The WDA Savings Club is not a dental insurance plan, it is a modern dental savings plan that will make dentistry more convenient and affordable for patients. The savings club boasts higher fee schedules, which will be updated annually, faster payments and access to more than 1 million consumers in the state of Wisconsin. Registration is seamless and there are no contracts to sign, meaning you can end participation at any time.

The Wisconsin Dental Political Action Committee (WIDPAC) needs the support of member dentists. Positive relationships established through WIDPAC ensure that the WDA remains a trusted resource for state lawmakers. It is critical that we continue to foster a political environment where dentists are contacted and included in the conversation for legislation that affects the profession of dentistry. Financial contributions from WDA dentists are directed to state-level candidates with solid records of supporting dentistry and oral health. WIDPAC support is bipartisan and seeks to support candidates who support dentists. Please consider contributing.

Dr. Cheska Avery-Stafford will complete her second three-year term in November of 2024 and is therefore not eligible to run again. Deadline for applying for the WDA Region 3 Trustee seat is April 1, 2024. Those interested need to complete an online application, as well as submit a CV and headshot on wda.org.

Please plan to participate in the scheduled virtual WDA Town Hall meetings. The first town hall was held on February 21st while the two remaining town halls are scheduled for June 25th and September 19th. WDA Leadership and guest speakers will share the latest news on what is happening in the state as it pertains to dentistry. We are in a time of significant movement in many aspects of dentistry including new legislation and disruption in the dental insurance marketplace. We are pleased to report on these positive achievements in the state of Wisconsin and hope to continue to shine light on the value of membership in organized dentistry.
